Proclamation


Honoring the Memory of Thomas Claron Jackson
January 20, 1953 – July 3, 2019

- Whereas** Thomas Claron Jackson was born in Mount Airy, North Carolina and spent much of his childhood in Edenton, North Carolina. Jackson later attended North Carolina State University, and used his degree in civil engineering to found and run a construction business, as well as serve as a steward and caretaker for his church facility at the North Raleigh Church of Christ for thirty years; and
- Whereas** Thomas Claron Jackson served one term on the Creedmoor Board of Commissioners, and regularly attended Planning Board, and South Granville Water and Sewer Authority meetings, where he was known as an outspoken proponent for the citizens of Creedmoor; and
- Whereas** Thomas Claron Jackson regularly remarked on his pride in his family, including his daughter Sheree Jackson, brother Steve Jackson, daughter-in-law Jan Jackson; and
- Whereas** Thomas Claron Jackson dedicated much of his life to making the City of Creedmoor a better place, and was known by many for his passion of civic affairs and the Boy Scouts of America for which he served on local, regional, state, and national councils.
- Now, Therefore** I, Robert V. Wheeler, Mayor of the City of Creedmoor, North Carolina, do hereby proclaim Monday, August 12, 2019 as Thomas Claron Jackson Day in the City of Creedmoor.
